On Ash Wednesday, we will have a day and an evening time to gather. Starting with Soup/Study (at noon and 6pm) followed by a Worship Service with Disposition of Ashes and Communion (at 1pm and 7pm).

Our worship will include the option of walking a labyrinth. The labyrinth goes back 5,000 years or more. Beginning in the Middle Ages, Christianity adopted the labyrinth as a symbol, changing the design to imbue it with specifically Christian meaning. For almost a thousand years there has been an identifiable Christian labyrinth tradition. This movement reached its peak at Chartres Cathedral, in France, with the installation of an elegant labyrinth into the nave floor in 1201 during the construction of the magnificent new Gothic structure.

The labyrinth which we will walk will be built from food cans which will later be donated to NESAP and Tree of Friends Foodbanks.



The Committee uses a "Capture Log" to record problems and opportunities presented to the Committee. We can report that actions on 25 of the 26 inputs received to date are "Completed or Addressed". One new input has been referred to the Worship and Music Committee and is "In Process". Recognize that these inputs are frequently anonymous and are considered confidential.

#### A Balance for Effective Ministry (Pastor's Report)

We continue to focus on the Pastor and his family's well being at each of our meetings with a report from the Pastor. Items of note from our January meeting include:

\*The Pastor posted an ambitious set of 2017 goals in the January Visitor. Church Council will make more detailed and measurable plans to follow.

\*Immanuel will be launching our involvement in the Maryland Faith Health Network in February. The Pastor is seeking a "Point Person" from the congregation to serve in this new program.

\*In support of his goal to spend more time in prayer, reflection, and journaling as he seeks God's Will for his life and Immanuel, the Pastor has established a prayer and meditation day (first Thursday of each month). He recently attended the Carmelite Monastery in Towson for this purpose. He continues for Spiritual Guidance to meet monthly at the Aisling Retreat House in Manchester.

\*Physical workout and training at the "Y" continues on Mon, Wed, and Fridays, and has been effective in maintaining physical health.

Take a moment to sit down and reminisce through albums of former catechism classes, Luther League youth groups and Ladies Aid Society functions along with many newspaper clippings saved to remember Immanuel through the years!

#### TRANSFIGURATION SUNDAY

The Transfiguration of Our Lord will be held on February 26th at the 9am service. This festival is a bridge between the Advent-Christmas-Epiphany cycle that comes to a close and the Lent-Easter cycle that begins on Ash Wednesday, March 1<sup>st</sup>.
