Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ. I am writing this on the morning after Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday. What a day it turned out to be! At both services we received in the form of ashes on our foreheads the best Valentine ever: the assurance that although we are mere mortal creatures who come from dust and will return to dust, we are loved with an everlasting love by God who became a mortal creature so that nothing will ever be able to separate us from God's love. This reminder became especially poignant at our evening service when, that very afternoon, 17 students and staff at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida were murdered in yet another mass shooting by a troubled young man armed with an assault rifle. All the victims, and the 14 others who were wounded, were and are precious children of God who did not deserve what happened to them. When will it end??

During the season of Lent this year, our theme is Listening to God. With all that is going on in the world around us and in our own community, we need more than ever to listen to what God is saying to us in our personal times of prayer and in our study of God's Word, both individually and in worship and small group Bible study. We also need to open our hearts and minds to what God is saying to us through our brothers and sisters in God's family and in the neighborhood.

I believe that if there is an answer to the senseless slaughter in Parkland and elsewhere, God will show us if we come together to seek God with all our heart and are prepared to act on what God shows us.

"I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you. When you search for me, you will find me; if you seek me with all your heart, I will let you find me, says the Lord." (Jeremiah 29:11-14)

STEWARDSHIP

STEWARDSHIP: GIVING IN SECRET

"Beware of practicing your piety before others in order to be seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Father in heaven. So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your alms may be done in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you." (Matt. 6:1-4)

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus warns us of the danger of turning faith practices into religious performances. Giving to the poor (also known as almsgiving) was in Jesus' day one of the major ways of expressing one's faith in God, as it is today. It is good to give gladly, willingly, sacrificially to those in need, remembering that what God has given to us belongs at least as much to our neighbor in need as it does to us. But when our giving becomes a public performance, to demonstrate to others (and to God) what wonderful, generous people we are, our giving misses the mark.

This is why Jesus tells us that Christian giving is to be done in secret, to avoid even the slightest whiff of self-centered giving. If possible, we should even keep it a secret from ourselves! This may also be one reason why we find it difficult to talk about giving in church. It truly is a matter between each believer and God. At Immanuel, as in most churches, we respect the biblical principle of giving in secret. Estimates of annual giving are known to and recorded by only one person: the financial secretary. The same person is the one who sends out periodic statements of giving.

I do not know how much you give to God's work through Immanuel, and I do not want to know because I do not want my pastoral care to be influenced in any way (even subconsciously) by how much a person gives. You are a person of immeasurable worth to God, and to me, regardless how much or how little you give. If you need me for any reason, please let me know, and I will be there for you as I am able.

Not knowing, and not wanting to know, how much you are giving, I trust that you are giving to God's work here at Immanuel and to your neighbor in need according to the ways God has blessed you and as the Spirit guides you. May you grow in your giving, as God gives you the opportunity, so that Immanuel Church may grow in mission and more souls may be brought to Christ! Yours in Christ,

LEAD: THE VALUE OF COACHING

A critically important part of our LEAD process for the next few years is the opportunity for our LEAD Team to be guided and encouraged by a trained coach, with whom our pastor and LEAD facilitator will meet monthly. Our coach will be Pastor Patrick Gahagen, from Journey of Faith Lutheran Church in Windsor Mill. Let me share with you how LEAD understands the value of congregational coaching. Rozella White writes:

While a well-known tool for empowering and equipping leaders in other industries, coaching is still misunderstood or unheard of within faith communities. Many of us know the power of therapy, mentoring and spiritual direction but we haven't explored how coaching might be a tool that is beneficial to ongoing leadership development.

LEAD is an organization that believes in the power of coaching to help people become faithful leaders who nurture their spiritual lives while growing in their adaptive skills. Much like the athletic coaches of my past and the coach I was to young people, LEAD coaches are a resource to empower leaders in their ongoing development. Athletes wouldn't dare compete without the support of a coach. Why would leaders, tasked with transforming faith communities and influencing the world, NOT partner with a coach in order to fulfill their call?

When was the last time you had an accountability partner? When was the last time you did some serious visioning for your own leadership? When was the last time you created space in your life to listen to your leadership voice within? When was the last time you had someone cheering you on as you continued to develop your gifts and passions?

It is LEAD's goal to offer excellent coaching services to leaders and teams that help you understand yourself, envision change and transform your community. They will ask thought provoking questions that make you look within for answers. They will encourage you to articulate your goals and help you craft plans to meet them. Their primary concern is to help you reach your fullest potential and recommend resources to aid in your development.

We are looking forward to working with our coach as we seek to discover and live out God's will for us as a congregation, and God's will for our neighborhood.

T mobile has installed their device. We will receive a check for \$1100. This is a 3 year agreement and is an experiment for them. If after three years they decide it is a good fit for them they may elect to renegotiate to keep the same equipment or maybe install a larger system. They felt confident that there was a very good chance they may consider a larger system given the fact they had plans of installing one a few years back but regulations squashed that plan. This is now phase2 of the same plan from before.

Kitchen bids are slowly coming in.

Westminster Glass and 84 Lumber came out and took measurements to replace the 2 main church doors. Both applications will not disturb the upper glass transoms and will fit within the existing frames as to not disrupt the aesthetics of the building. Awaiting estimates from both. One application to consider will be glass doors, the other a more traditional Fiberglass door. The doors have been become a safety and energy loss issue.

There have been concerns about excessive flies in the second floor of the education building. The exterminator will check them out on their monthly visit scheduled for the 20th of this month and make recommendations.

Steve had Westminster Security company reinstall the magnetic security tabs on the 2 main doors. They were initially installed with tape and continued to fall off but are now secured by screws.

We need to have the fire sprinkler system inspected. We are in the process of having that set up.

The down stairs bathroom toilet was leaking when used during coffee hour. Naylors Plumbing came out to install a new wax ring. All seems to be fine. We are in the process of getting estimates on replacing the faucet handle in the down stairs bathrooms with a more economical type. The current faucets run for quite a while after turning them on using excessive water.

PASSION SATURDAY ~ PALM SUNDAY WEEKEND

At the weekend services of March 24th and 25th, we will celebrate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem by processing around the sanctuary with palm crosses and banners. During the gospel, members from the congregation will present 'The Passion of Our Lord, According to Mark'.

MAUNDY THURSDAY

Immanuel will begin **Thursday evening**, **March 29**th in the Social Hall enjoying a special **Agape or Love Feast** that will be served beginning at 6pm. Everyone will move to the sanctuary for our **Maundy Thursday Service at 7pm**. Our Lenten observance comes to an end, and we gather with Christians around the world to celebrate the Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection. At the heart of the Maundy Thursday liturgy is Jesus' new commandment "To love one another." As Jesus washed the feet of his disciples, we will be called to follow his example as we humbly care for one another, especially the poor and the unloved. Pastor Charlie will offer the custom of Jesus' <u>Washing of Feet</u>, along with an alternative of <u>Washing of Hands</u> at the Baptismal Font. Holy Communion will be administered to all. The service ends with Psalm 22 and the Stripping of the Altar. There is neither a Benediction or Dismissal, since the Triduum is seen as one ongoing service.

GOOD FRIDAY

Our Good Friday Service is March 30th at 7pm in the sanctuary. At the heart of the Good Friday liturgy is the Passion of Jesus according to John. With simple dignity that story is retold, highlighted by special meditations and music, followed by prayers. Our Tenebrae Service, which literally means the extinguishing of lights or 'Service of Shadows', will invite you into your imagination with those that we just read about in John's gospel. The Stations of the Cross will be read as the sanctuary lights are dimmed and the altar candles are extinguished one by one, allowing for time of personal reflection. The service will end with a silent departure. Our Good Friday Service is a spiritually moving service of love and respect.

VIGIL OF EASTER

On Saturday, March 31 at 5pm, we will observe a Vigil of Easter Service. The service will begin in a darkened auditorium of the church but will later proceed into the sanctuary as a symbol of the Passover of Jesus' death into the brilliant light of his resurrection. This 'vigil service' of darkness into a service of light and Easter proclamation will only strengthen our belief that Jesus is truly the 'Light of the World'! Come and witness the vigil, our wait is almost over. Let the Alleluias begin!

HAPPY EASTER MORNING

Take advantage of Immanuel's two Easter Morning Services on Sunday, April 1. Our Easter Sunrise Service will begin at 7AM, followed by an Easter Breakfast, sponsored by Fellowship, in the Social Hall at 8:15.
