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From The Pastor's Desk....

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Back in February, I mentioned how strangely fitting it was that Ash Wednesday should fall on Valentine's Day this year. And then, on that same day, came the horrible shooting at Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida. We saw hatred and love, death and life side by side as young lives were gunned down while others risked and gave their lives to protect others. I write to you today on the day after thousands of students across the country took 17 minutes of their day to remember those who were killed and to call for an end to the killing. On Saturday, March 24, thousands of students and others will gather in Washington DC and elsewhere to add their own voices in the March for Our Lives.

It seems strange indeed in light of all this to talk about Easter falling on April Fools Day this year. But I will, because there is a connection. April Fools Day is a day for pranks and practical jokes, getting someone to believe something outrageous and then saying, "April Fools!" When Satan succeeded in getting enough people together to reject in hatred the only Son of God who came in love, and watched as Jesus was nailed to a cross and as his lifeless body was laid in a stone-sealed tomb, Satan was sure he had won the ultimate victory. History and the entire human race would now belong to him.

But early on Easter morning, God rolled the stone away from the tomb and said to Satan, "April Fools!" What Satan had thought his greatest victory turned out to be his worst defeat. What Satan thought was the victory of hatred over love turned out to be the victory of love over hatred. What Satan thought was the victory of death over life turned out to be life's victory over death. After the killings at Stoneman Douglas, it may appear that hatred and death still have the upper hand.


But the events that have followed, with our own children leading the way, tell another story. At the end of the story is a Cross and an Empty Tomb, and God's final "April Fools!"

GATHERING OVERVIEW

Every three years, 30,000+ high school youth and adult leaders spend a week together in interactive learning, worship, Bible study, service and fellowship. They are challenged to live their faith in their daily lives.

GATHERING THEME

The 2018 ELCA Youth Gathering theme is "This Changes Everything." Our primary scripture is Ephesians 2:8

*"For by grace you have been saved through faith,
and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God."*

Grace is a foundational and distinctive piece of the Lutheran faith. This gift, undeserved and freely given, changes lives and perspectives as people realize they are enough because of what Christ has done and are called into the world to serve their neighbor and share the good news.

Our logo is a visual representation of our theme and the 2018 experience.

It incorporates the coming together of a mosaic to reflect the diverse host city of Houston, as well as the idea that we are a church where *all* are imperfect and incomplete, yet we each belong in –and have an important place in– God's masterpiece.

The cross at the center of the logo is the focus – it's God's grace, through Christ's life, death and resurrection, that changes everything for all people. Ultimately, we want youth to understand the fierce love that God has for them, just as they are, and that by grace, through faith, they have been saved. When young people (or any age!) truly claim this reality, *it indeed changes everything.*

LEAD SUNDAY APRIL 8, 2018

The LEAD process at Immanuel is well underway. Immanuel's LEAD team has met twice and also attended a two day learning seminar in February. In addition, Pastor Charlie and I, as the LEAD facilitator, have met with our coach Pastor Patrick Gahagen. As we begin our LEAD journey, our initial focus will be on the development of effective listening skills. We will be applying those skills through prayer and Bible study, and in conversations with members of the congregation and the community as we begin the work to discern what God wants for Immanuel.

One of our first projects will be a congregational assessment. This brief 20 question survey will be an important facet of our work as we examine how members of Immanuel view our church and its purpose. This assessment is much different from the comprehensive and detailed survey administered in the summer of 2017. After sharing basic demographic information, you are given 20 statements. Participants are asked to choose a response that best describes our congregation. It is important that as many members as possible complete the assessment, and that a wide range of people in all stages of life are represented. The data will be analyzed, interpreted, and shared by the LEAD organization. The LEAD team at Immanuel will have an established baseline for indicators that are considered to be vital standards for growing congregations. Subsequently, we'll work as a team and as a congregation to develop the behaviors that will help us grow deeper in faith and wider in mission.

The kickoff for the assessment, available both online and in paper form, will be April 8. That same day, members of the LEAD team will be commissioned. We are asking that you make a commitment to pray for and support Immanuel's LEAD team. We also ask that you let your voice be heard and complete the congregational assessment. May God bless the work that we do together as we discover His will for His church.

We are currently researching our insurance policy to determine what releases users would need to sign to allow members or non members to use this equipment. Check the weekly bulletin for updates.
- Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (CRASE) training is being scheduled for the congregation in response to a number of requests. We have not yet heard back from the trainer, Jon Hill from the MD State Police. Updated information will be published in the weekly bulletin and in Pastor Charlie's weekly email.


The generosity of our sponsor is a true blessing, and I hope you pray on it and consider this great opportunity for your child to attend a week this summer!


Youth Sunday

STEPHEN MINISTRY

“Immanuel Lutheran is a Stephen Ministry congregation.”

I often wondered what that phrase meant. I read the little card in the church pew and felt intrigued. How does our congregation go about offering Christian care to people in need within our community? One way is through Stephen Ministers. They are members of the congregation who are trained to help people going through difficult times by providing a caring, trustworthy, and listening advocate. When I retired from teaching at CLS last June, I felt pulled to explore this ministry to serve God more fully.

An opportunity for my Stephen Ministry training was found by Mr. Nicoll, at Covenant of Grace Presbyterian Church in Reisterstown. Their congregation has a very active group of trained Stephen Ministry leaders who are providing the instruction for eight new Stephen Ministers. I feel very welcomed to take part in training with the six members of Covenant of Grace congregation and one participant from another church. One of the first activities completed was to choose prayer partners from the group. My partner is the member from another congregation. Knowing that she is praying for my needs is an unexpected benefit from taking part in the program.

Our group has been meeting on Sunday afternoons for about two hours each week since January 14th. We also took part in a full retreat day of learning. Trainees are assigned reading material to complete before each class. Much of the learning takes place through the role-playing of different situations and discussion of the best ways to react to the needs of others in compassionate ways. Scripture from the Bible is shared as the foundation for each training session.

The topics covered are interesting and helpful to anyone who would like to develop better relationships with their family and friends. Our first topic was how to give care that is uniquely Christian. This theme is continuing throughout the training. We have been taught to share the truth with others in a loving manner firmly rooted in our Faith in Jesus.

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**STEPHEN
MINISTRY**

Being assertive rather than passive or aggressive was an important topic for everyone to review as relating to others in this manner shows respect for yourself and others. We have also discussed setting healthy boundaries and the possibility of referring our care receivers for extra help. The importance of confidentiality for the care receivers has been stressed in every lesson. More important information will be discussed in the weeks to come.

The Stephen Ministry training will be completed in a retreat at Bon Secours, where we will talk about how we will be supervised in our ministry to our care receiver. Although care is given on a one to one basis, we are given consistent guidance. The Stephen Ministers at Immanuel Lutheran Church have meetings once a month where we can receive help. Leaders are also available to talk about how to help our care receivers as needed.

I have found the training for the Stephen Ministry rewarding. The program is very beneficial to members of the congregation and the community in general. I look forward to finishing my training and using these new skills to be a listening ear for someone who will benefit from Christian care.
