From The Pastor's Desk.... Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

MISSION STATEMENT

Our Mission, as disciples of Jesus, is to commit ourselves to making Christ known through worship, service, outreach, learning and loving one another.

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I am writing this on Monday, April 16, the day after our latest Youth Sunday (and the day after the newsletter deadline: my apologies to Rachel). What a joy it was to watch and listen to our children and youth help to lead us in worship! The Word of God reaches me in a new way when I hear it read in a child's voice. And there is no comparing the welcome I feel during the sharing of the peace when a little one runs up to me and wraps his arms around my knees, or the joy I feel when listening to the Sunday School Choir singing "This is the day that the Lord has made; we will rejoice and be glad in it."

Every congregation has core values that help define who we are and how we live together as the Body of Christ. During the LEAD process in which we are now engaged, we will identify and clarify those values. In the two years I have been here, one core value I have experienced regularly is: "Children belong in worship." I believe this value comes straight from the Bible, where Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs." (Matt. 19:14, Mark 10:14 & Luke 18:16)

We are blessed to have many children coming to Jesus week after week in our worship services. In obedience to Jesus' clear teaching, we do all we can to support them and those who bring them to Jesus.

- *We have a growing children's choir, "All God's Children."
- *Four children have joined our now intergenerational Chimes Choir.
- *We have activity bags to help our little ones keep themselves occupied during worship.
- *We offer Baby Sunday School in the Pre-School Room for little ones accompanied by a parent or caregiver most Sundays during worship (after children's sermon to before Communion is served).
- *We have brought the sound system into the Oak Tree Room as well as the Pre-School Room so that nursing mothers and others with small children can listen to the service while caring for their children.
- *And of course, children are always welcome in the pews with their families throughout the worship service.

Welcoming children into worship comes with a cost. Worshiping with children present can be noisy and distracting for other worshipers. Here two more core values come into play: the mutual respect we owe each other as members of the Body of Christ, and the ultimate respect we owe to God. When we come to worship, we gather not as individuals, each doing our own thing, but as a single Body worshiping God together, respecting the needs of our fellow worshipers above our own so that we can all give God our fullest attention, our deepest love and gratitude, and our highest praise. Thus, our older members make allowances for our little ones for the sake of having the whole Body of Christ worship God together, while our younger members and their families show deep concern and respect for the needs of our older members to be able to hear and participate fully in worship with them.

This is much longer than my usual monthly letter, so I will end here and continue next month. If you have any suggestions how we can worship God together more faithfully and effectively, please let me know. I'd like to keep the conversation going!

"May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus, so that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ." (Romans 15:5-6)

NOISY CHANGE OFFERING

Last year, the congregations of our DE/MD Synod donated more than ^{\$}22,000 to ELCA World Hunger by collecting loose change in a "Noisy Change Offering." WE WANT TO HEAR FROM YOU!

The congregational survey conducted last summer at Immanuel by our Mutual Ministry Committee identified two key areas needing attention: improving communication and increasing member involvement. We have been working on both and have found them to be connected. It's hard to get involved in something you don't know about, and equally hard to commit yourself to something about which you have had no say. That's why communication at Immanuel should flow freely in both directions: from our church leaders to our members and worshipers, and from our members and worshipers to our church leaders. I believe the Holy Spirit speaks to us as we speak and listen to each other in mutually respectful conversation.

On behalf of our congregation's leadership team, myself very much included, I say: We want to hear from you, because God is speaking to us through you. If you have a concern or a suggestion, call any of us on the phone. Send a letter, email or text message. Drop a note in the Mutual Ministry box in the back of the sanctuary. Send a message by carrier pigeon. Attend a council or committee meeting. Request a personal visit. (OK, I was kidding about the carrier pigeon!)

There will be opportunities to make your ideas and feelings known as the LEAD process continues this spring and summer.

As you communicate with us in any form, please identify yourself as the sender of the message. Anonymous communications make mutually respectful conversation impossible, because there is no one to respond to, and can sometimes do great damage to a congregation if mishandled. This includes communicating anonymously through another person, who passes along the message without disclosing the source. Harmful gossip typically works this way and can be especially destructive because it is so hidden.

Stewardship is what we do with what God has entrusted to us, including how we care for our church. One of the most important things we can do as stewards of God's Church is to keep the lines of mutually respectful communication open in both directions. Healthy communication is the lifeblood of the church.

The following items were discussed at the council meeting in April.

The on-going problem we experienced in the Social Hall during the Lenten season-lights going on and off at will- has been taken care of for the present time. A breaker was replaced and a 3 way switch was replaced.

There have been no more reported problems with toilets leaking in the downstairs bathrooms.

The conversation about replacing the main doors to the Narthex and education building has been tabled until more information can be obtained.

The burners were replaced on the gas stove to make it safe to use. This is a simple fix to prevent any problems until the kitchen renovations are in full gear.

The ongoing problem with the floor drains in the kitchen is being addressed before kitchen renovations are slated to begin. A break in the drain line must be repaired before we move forward. There are also additional concerns with the sinks in the kitchen. All of these issues will be resolved before any kitchen renovations start.

All of the plans for the kitchen renovation are like dominoes with one thing depending on another. Rest assured the property committee are resolving items [one at a time] so effort and \$\$\$\$ are not wasted.

Judd's Fire sprinkler company inspected the sprinkler system. Waiting for information to get certified. Also, the fire extinguishers will be certified as well.

Special Offering for the May monthly mission will be collected for Boy Scout Troop 320.

Immanuel Lutheran Church is the charter organization of Boy Scout Troop 320. Our congregation has been helping support Boy Scout Troop 320, which was established in 1932, for over 86 years. The scouts in turn have been a committed support organization that has also helped the church in many service projects over the years. One of the recent Eagle Scout projects was the installation of the large cross outside the front-side of our building. The scouts also recently participating in the "Scouting for Food" program in Manchester that collected two large vehicles full of food for NESAP.

This past year has been particularly challenging raising funds which helps support our scout camping trips, activities, supplies, and service projects while keeping costs low for our young members. One of our big fundraisers has been selling refreshments at Thomas Tree Farm which was cut short this year due to less mature trees being available. Since then we have also executed a plan to try many new fundraiser activities going forward this year. We are also asking the congregation for their help as well.

Some facts about the troop:

- We are a "Boy-Led" Troop with many leadership opportunities for our Scouts.
- We have had many scouts earn the prestigious Eagle rank. Two scouts this year alone will earn their Eagle. Only 4% of all scouts will achieve this.
- We have many "Fully Trained" Scoutmasters and have several leaders participating in "WoodBadge" training which is considered the pinnacle of adult BSA Leader training.
- If you look at our calendar you see we camp A LOT! If you were to camp every scheduled trip this year with Troop 320 you could have 20+ nights of tent camping in just your first year.

As years passed our visits changed. The memories and stories become intermingled and sometimes there was a new version. We always felt comfortable, unassuming and at ease with each other. You never wanted to say goodbye, you would always say as I was leaving "God Bless You" and watch out for the Smokies. I love you.

Jesus sent his disciples forth to baptize in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. More than just a doctrine, the Holy Trinity expresses the heart of our faith. We experience the God of creation made know in Jesus and with us through the Holy Spirit. This mystery is celebrated through word and sacrament each week at the communion table.
