From The Pastor's Desk....

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Beginning in May, and continuing into June, I have been reading through the book of Acts with those who have responded to my Bible Challenge. This book is well-named; it is an action-packed telling of the birth and growth of the Christian movement powered and guided by the Holy Spirit. It is a "must read" for anyone interested in growing the church today.

In Acts 6:1-7, our reading for May 17, we see a rapidly growing church going through growing pains. As large numbers of newcomers arrive, overwhelming the existing members, the newcomers begin to complain that their people are being overlooked in the daily distribution of food. When they bring their complaint to the leadership, the apostles correctly perceive that the problem is not food service but leadership. They tell the whole congregation to choose seven good men to oversee the situation, and the congregation elects seven of the newcomers who become the first deacons, and church leaders in their own right – including Stephen, a powerful witness to Jesus, who becomes the first martyr to the faith. With the expanded leadership in place, "the number of the disciples increased greatly." (Acts 6:7)

Most churches in our day are not facing the problem of what to do with all the new members who are pouring in, but the problem of how to move the church from decline to growth. Although the question is different, the answer may well be the same. The key to growing the church and sustaining growth is not just bringing in more members, but expanding the leadership core to include new voices, new

perspectives, new energy. As we grow our leadership, we will grow in membership by the power of the Holy Spirit working through all our leaders.

REFORMATION 500

We will gather as a Conference in celebration of the Reformation 500th at Big Baker Chapel on the campus of McDaniel College on Sunday, **October 29 at 3:30pm**. Our hope is that we would fill the chapel with 500 people for this significant anniversary.

The preacher will be The Rev. Dr. Mark Oldenburg of Gettysburg Seminary. Music will be coordinated by Ted Dix, organist/choirmaster at Grace Lutheran Church, assisted by Dr. Margaret Boudreaux, professor of music at McDaniel College and director of the Masterworks Chorale. The Masterworks Chorale and the College Choir will provide special music and they along with a joint choir of our conference churches' choirs will support the singing during the service. (All choirs are invited to participate! Dr. Boudreaux and Mr. Dix will be in touch with choir directors over the summer about music. A rehearsal with musicians will occur at 2pm that Sunday, the 29th.)

We will offer a Children's Sermon by Pastor Kristin Dubsky of St. John's Lutheran Church and Pastor Andy Carr of St. Mark's Hampstead.

Additionally, there will be congregational banners created by conference churches youth with the theme – "What do you think the Lutheran church can bring to our world today?" All youth groups are invited to make their own and appoint a banner bearer.

All rostered ministers are invited to process. Communion will be celebrated and distributed by intinction. An offering collected during the service for Carroll Lutheran School.

Additionally, opportunity to dine at local eateries after the service will be given to attendees so that a portion of their dinner tab will be given to The Shepherd's Staff and NESAP and Caring & Sharing of Northwest Carroll. The list of the eateries will be published in the service bulletin.

We are working on two additional opportunities to celebrate this momentous occasion and will hopefully occur in 2018 as we provide a Reformation for Families event and an Ecumenical Celebration with our Catholic neighbors.

STEWARDSHIP

The 10-10-80 Approach to Money Management

Stewardship is about so much more than how we use our money! It is about how we use all the blessings we receive from God so that we can be a blessing to others: our time and energy, our gifts and abilities and life experiences, the precious gift of forgiveness and new life in Christ, and more. Along with all these things, stewardship is about money. And not just about how much money we put in the offering plate (or give online) each week. Stewardship is about how faithfully and effectively we manage all our financial resources.

One helpful and very simple way of looking at faithful money management is the 10-10-80 approach.

First, we give 10% of our income (called a tithe) to support God's work in the world through our church and perhaps through other organizations doing God's work.

Second, we save 10% of our income. This money is carefully invested so that it can grow to be drawn from in emergencies and be used for special giving opportunities above and beyond our tithe. If we start saving early in life, continue faithfully and invest wisely, we can create a substantial pool of accumulated wealth with which to care for ourselves and our families and to serve God.

Third, we **spend 80%** of our income to provide for our basic needs. This is a real challenge in a time when our consumer society teaches us to spend 100% or even more, on things that advertisers tell us we need.

If you're already following this approach, great! If not, try **shifting 1-2%** of your income at a time from spending to giving and saving, and see the difference it makes. And if you are raising children, find ways to teach them this basic principle of good stewardship, too.

May God bless you so that you can be a blessing to others!

MUTUAL MINISTRY

In order to carry out its purpose more fully, the Mutual Ministry committee decided to formulate and conduct a survey of the congregation to get a sense of the state of the congregation, and to surface "important issues, joys and concerns" regarding the pastor and our congregation for discussion and follow-up.



The last survey activity at Immanuel was initiated by the Schennings in 2005, and repeated again in 2009.

This survey was developed by the Hartford Institute for Religion Research in Connecticut (www.hartfordinstitute.org). They are an experienced and respected organization in this field. We have gone through several editing iterations to make the instrument more relevant to our particular needs and interests.

Each member of our church household over the age of 15 will be asked to complete the survey. We are encouraging all who have Internet access to complete this survey online for convenience.

For those without Internet access, or for those preferring a paper survey, members can complete it and return it to the church. Our team will enter the results online. This survey will take approximately 20 minutes to complete. All responses are anonymous!

We will be launching this activity in early June when the survey is published. We will be providing more information and reminders at church and in our bulletins over the coming weeks.

PENTECOST WEEKEND

At the weekend services on June 3-4, Immanuel will celebrate the Festival of Pentecost. This festival derives its name from the Jewish festival of Pentecost, observed fifty days after Passover. On the fiftieth day of Easter, we celebrate the Holy Spirit as the power of God among us that heals, forgives, inspires, and unites. In John's gospel the risen Christ breathes the Spirit on his followers on Easter evening. In this one spirit, we are baptized into one body and at the Lord's table, the Spirit unites us for witness in the

world. Pentecost is sometimes called the Church's birthday, but might more appropriately be called its Baptism Day, since the gift of the Spirit is the fullness of baptism. The color for Pentecost is RED. We encourage you to wear something RED.

THE HOLY TRINITY

Holy Trinity will be celebrated on Sunday, June 11th. Though the word, trinity, is not found in the scriptures, Sunday's second reading (2 Corinthians 13: 11-3) includes the apostolic greeting that begins the liturgy: "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all". Jesus send his disciples forth to baptize in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. More than a doctrine, the Trinity expresses the heart of our faith: we have experienced the God of creation made known in Jesus Christ and with us always through the Holy Spirit. On June 11th, we will celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity in word and sacrament, as we profess the creed, and as we are sent into the world to bear witness to our faith.
