Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

About the time you read this newsletter, we will be celebrating the Fourth of July, the day in 1776 when representatives of the thirteen colonies, still firmly under British rule, signed their names to a dangerous document that boldly declared, "We hold these truths to be self evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." Because they saw their political freedom as a gift granted by God and not by some foreign king who had trampled on their freedom again and again, they also declared "that these United Colonies are, and of Right ought to be Free and Independent States; that they are Absolved from all Allegiance to the British Crown."

They did not ask King George to grant them independence. They did not need to. They simply declared that they were already free and independent states, no longer answerable to the British crown. And they fought a long and bloody war, a war which had already begun, to defend the liberty that they believed was a God-given right that no one could take from them.

At the beginning of our worship every Sunday we make another kind of declaration: a declaration of dependence when we publicly admit that "we are in bondage to sin and cannot free ourselves." No matter how much political freedom we enjoy as Americans, the sin that lives in our hearts keeps us from exercising our freedom responsibly and lovingly for the sake of God and our neighbor. The only way to be set free from our bondage to sin is to declare our complete dependence upon the grace and mercy of God in Jesus Christ who purchased our freedom by his shedding his blood on the Cross. Then we are able to receive once again the declaration that sets us free: "As a called and ordained minister of the church of Christ and by his authority I declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins."

29TH ANNUAL DE-MD SYNOD ASSEMBLY

During the Synod Assembly, voting members engaged in the process of electing a bishop. After hearing from many fine candidates, the field was narrowed to two: Bishop Wolfgang Herz-Lane and the Rev. Bill Gohl, Pastor of Epiphany Lutheran Church in Baltimore, Maryland. On the fifth ballot, the Assembly elected Pastor Gohl to be our next bishop. He received 227 votes, and Bishop Wolfgang received 225. This close vote communicates that we were blessed with two outstanding final candidates for the Office of Bishop in our synod. Bishop-Elect Gohl will take office on September 1. A date for his installation will be announced.

Your Church Council met on Tuesday, June 14, 2016 in the Martin Luther room . The following business was discussed:

NEW BUSINESS

Lazarus United Church of Christ will have a celebration service in the Sanctuary and Social hall of Immanuel on Saturday, July 16 at 1pm. All use of church fees have been waived and unanimously approved by Immanuel's council.

Concrete work is needed on Immanuel's outside walkways. Estimates have been secured. Finance and Council discussed the pros and cons at length. A combined meeting is being scheduled to discuss all options regarding the concrete work. When the two committees reach a mutual agreement, the congregation will be advised before we move forward.

OLD BUSINESS

After a lengthy discussion regarding Finance committee recommendations, Church council voted unanimously to sell Immanuel's parsonage "as is". No monies will be invested into any repairs at the parsonage. Currently the sale is in negotiations with a Manchester family who is willing to purchase the parsonage "as is".

The Property committee is working with Charles Briscoe, Culinary Concepts to find a general contractor that will fit our need in the kitchen remodeling project.

Your Property committee had hoped that by this newsletter mailing an established plan would have been in place for the church kitchen — A plan that would comply with all building code and use which would satisfy the health department and the county permits agency.

A kitchen planning contractor has visited the site and is working on assembling a group of trade professionals to help us create this plan and work the project. This is definitely a priority project but Immanuel is at the mercy of third party schedules. We ask your patience and understanding as we plow through the logistics of this project.

You may have noticed that the sidewalks and concrete at Immanuel are in need of repair and replacement. This has been brought to Church council for consideration and you will be receiving more details in the coming weeks.

The parsonage has not been sold at this time. Council unanimously approved selling the parsonage "as is" and not investing any additional money into repairs. The committee is currently in negotiations with a prospective buyer. More details to come.

The upkeep and risk that a vacant property creates can be a burden and we need to find a buyer ASAP. Frank Burnette has been maintaining the yard and we are grateful for his time and dedication.

*Remember:

A Kitchen Improvement Fund has been set up. This will support the memorial money designated towards improving the kitchen. There are envelopes in the back of the church for the fund or you may designate a donation on your offering envelope.



Because of the very nature of a "Mutual Ministry", our achievements are almost always the result of a cooperative process in which a concern or opportunity is identified by our committee, the Pastor, a Congregant, or Council, and we then put in place a plan to address them.

Activity over the past month includes:

- * The weekly Adult Sunday School Class is underway with our first session on June 12th. The Pastor led a well prepared discussion, and we had a nice group in attendance.
- * A productive meeting was held with Westminster United Methodist Church to better understand their Visitation Program. It has potential for us at Immanuel and we are evaluating a similar program for introduction in the near future. It will be proceeded with prayer and thoughtful preparation.
- * Immanuel is now "signed on" as a participant in the LifeBridge Pilot Program to partner with faith leaders to improve patient health and reduce hospital readmissions. "Navigators" in the hospitals will serve to match patients with community resources and support from area congregations. Pastor Charles is taking the lead in this venture.
- * Pending activities include concepts for conduct of healing services, and an approach to publicize our shut-ins so that our members can send cards.
 - * Pastor Charlie will add visitors and new members to his visitation list.

RED, WHITE and BLUE SUNDAY


