# From The Pastor's Desk...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

What a summer it has been at Immanuel Lutheran Church!
We had one of our best Vacation Bible Schools ever.

We hosted and fully embraced a new ministry partnership with the Manchester community: Kids Feeding Kids, where youth volunteers from the community prepared and served lunch each weekday for needy children and family members from the community.

Our Mutual Ministry committee conducted a congregational survey as a way of listening to the congregation covering a wide range of issues, and hosted a brunch and brainstorming session to begin to identify where we go from here.

Two keys to the future of Immanuel emerged from the survey: communication and involvement. Guided and empowered by the Holy Spirit, this is how I see us moving forward:

We will deepen and expand external communication between the congregation and the community, and communication between pastor and church members and among church members. All these lines of communication must be two-way. We will find as many ways as possible to get God's message out to all segments of the community and to listen to all the voices in our community, including our Spanish speaking neighbors. We will do the same with segments of the congregation, making sure that all voices are heard and that everyone is kept "in the loop" with what the Holy Spirit is doing, so that no one is excluded and all are

We will encourage all members to be fully involved in the life and mission of Immanuel. Rather than focusing on finding people to fill open positions, we will focus on helping people to find opportunities to serve according to the ways God has specially gifted them, and support them in their work.

Work has already begun in these key areas, some of which you will read about elsewhere in this newsletter. Much work needs to be done. In fact, the work of improving communication and involvement will never be finished, because the Holy Spirit is never finished with us! Yours in the Love of Christ,



# PRINCESS PILLOWCASE PROJECT

When I started to put together all of the statistics for this year, I was once again astounded at the numbers. A total of 3,259 dresses have been given to our missionaries for distribution throughout the world. In addition, 549 pair of shorts have been distributed throughout the countries listed below.

It's nearly impossible to thank all the individuals and groups who have contributed to this success. This year we have increased our North Carroll Senior Center workshops to twice a month, South Carroll Senior Center, under the direction of Karen Larrimore meets once a month and Patty Mattoon of Let's Dress The Girls practically has a revolving door at her home where they meet. Also Patty has helped a new group get started in the Westminster area under the name of Sew 2 Sow. It's a great community that we have been blessed with through this project.

Thanks to all the individuals who sew at home, those who have been with us for a long time and the newcomers as well. Every single dress or pair of shorts that are made means a lot to a child who has little or nothing. Thanks to all the missionaries who deliver our clothing, to all those who help with organizing, cutting, ironing, making kits and all the other jobs necessary to keep the project growing. Thanks to those who have made new connections for us, to everyone who has donated supplies and those who keep our work in their prayers. May you be blessed for your support. Here's where all our dresses, and shorts, have gone:

Our current totals since our beginning in September of 2010 are: 18,485 dresses and 4,415 pair of shorts. We are definitely making a difference in the world! In addition to clothing, hundreds of toiletry kits and sewing kits have been taken by our missionaries as well. These are very much appreciated.

I'm excited to think of what we have yet to accomplish. I will not be surprised at all if we reach 20,000 dresses by the end of the year. I thank all of you for your tireless efforts in making the Princess Pillowcase Project the success it has become. ~Love and blessings, June

# STEPHEN MINISTRY

An important part of the process of providing an effective support outreach to those in our church and community who are "in need" is that of Referrals.

There are a number of ways in which our Stephen Ministry Team is made aware of an individual who is going through a difficult time, and may benefit from the assignment of a confidential caregiver:

Through the Pastor and his visitation with our congregants. He meets with our Stephen Ministers on a regular basis.

Through referrals that come from the KIT Committee and their visits. Through the network of our Stephen Ministers who are always vigilant for those potentially in need of a support relationship.

Through you, our congregation, who are most often on the front lines with an individual or family experiencing a difficult life issue.

There are times within our Stephen Ministry organization when we do not have enough Ministers to serve in the needed caregiving relationships. But at this time we do have the capacity to help any new individuals in need. Please help us in the referral process. You can contact any of our team or the Pastor, and we will evaluate the need and make a caregiver assignment as appropriate.

# STEWARDSHIP: COUNT YOUR BLESSINGS!

We are beginning to plan for our fall Stewardship Campaign, "The Great Permission." This will be a new way of doing stewardship: moving from need-based to asset-based. Instead of focusing on our needs and trying to motivate one another to give more generously to meet those needs (with the likelihood that our needs will greatly exceed our giving), we will focus on our assets – all that God has blessed us with – and consider how we can combine those assets in creative ways to accomplish God's mission. In the words of the gospel hymn written by Johnson Oatman Jr in 1897:

Count your blessings, name them one by one,

Count your many blessings, see what God has done!

# OLD BUSNESS

Kids Feeding Kids has been very successful. On the average day, 25 meals are served to children of the community. In addition to feeding their bellies, the project is feeding their spiritual appetite. This is the first time many of the children have been inside a church. The project will end Friday, September 1, 2017.

The Mutual Ministry survey has been completed, the results tallied and the information was presented to the congregation on August 13 and 14. # MUTUAL MINISTRY

On the weekend of August 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> our committee had the opportunity to share a PowerPoint presentation with our worshippers showing a summary of the church survey conducted earlier this spring.
