On **October 31, 1517**, a German pastor and seminary professor named Martin Luther posted on the door of the parish church in Wittenberg a list of **95 Theses** (items for scholarly discussion and debate). The content of those 95 Theses set off a firestorm of controversy that soon spread across Europe and changed the Church and the course of history forever. This fall, we celebrate the 500th anniversary of this world-changing event which gave birth to the Lutheran Church. Listed below are some of the ways we will celebrate Reformation 500 here at Immanuel. Please join us!

STUDY OF LUTHER'S 95 THESES

Beginning **Sunday, Sept 17**, Pastor Charlie will lead a **study of Luther's 95 Theses** during the Sunday School hour following Sunday morning worship. We will follow a fascinating book by Dr. Timothy Wengert, retired seminary professor and Luther scholar, to gain a deeper understanding of the message of the Protestant Reformation and its meaning for our lives today.

500 BIBLES FOR CHINA

One of the key points of the Reformation was making the Holy Scriptures available in the language of the people for the first time. Martin Luther translated the Old and New Testaments into the German language. We will celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Reformation by providing **500 bibles** for the people of China to read in their own language, through the American Bible Society's **Bibles for China campaign**. With the help of the Bible Society, for every \$1 we donate, 1 Bible will be made available to someone in China. Help us to reach our goal of 500 bibles for our Reformation celebration! CONFIRMATION CLASS

Confirmation Class is part of a two-year process of spiritual formation preparing youth (age 12 and older) to take their place as adult members of the church. Its purpose is "to help young people to identify more deeply with Jesus Christ and his Church and to participate more fully in God's Mission in the world." One year of class time focuses on the message of the Bible, both Old and New Testaments, alternating with a one-year study of Luther's Small Catechism, and how both Bible and Catechism relate to our lives in today's world. This year (2017-2018) the focus will be on the Bible.

In addition to attendance at classes, students also attend and help at weekly worship (Saturday or Sunday), and participate as fully as possible in the life of the congregation including Sunday School, fellowship and service events, youth gatherings, special worship services, Vacation Bible School and summer camp.

Confirmation Class will meet on **Sunday evenings at 7pm** in the **Oak Tree Room**, beginning **Sept 17** and ending with the **Rite of Confirmation** for our second-year students on **Pentecost Sunday, May 20**. This schedule may be adjusted during the year as needed. Please notify the Pastor immediately if you would like to enroll in Confirmation Class, so that materials can be ordered.
