Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Let me extend to you a special invitation for the month of October. Immanuel Lutheran Church is participating in a nation-wide month of prayer for America called Pray 31. For 31 days in October, the overall goal is to have one million people in thousands of churches praying daily for our nation and especially for our nation's leaders and churches. Participants will pray for every state and U.S. territory following the Prayer Atlas that you can pick up at church. If you can't make it to church for your copy, call us and we will get a copy to you. It will take about 5 minutes per day of focused prayer for us to cover our whole nation in prayer. You can pray from wherever you are. I have reviewed this program and assure you that this prayer challenge is nonpartisan and nonpolitical. The prayer atlas also includes helpful teaching on prayer and numerous inspirational quotes from the bible and Christian authors on prayer.

Martin Luther wrote, "To be a Christian without prayer is no more possible than to be alive without breathing." As Christians we are all called to a life of prayer, to "pray without ceasing." (1 Thessalonians 5:17)

More specifically, as St. Paul wrote to Timothy: "First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and dignity. This is right and



is acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, who desires everyone to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth." (1 Timothy 2:1-4)

This months Mutual Ministry meeting focus was on the Pastor's workload and impacts on the family. As may be evident from the many current commitments and new programs for this fall, the pastor has "a full plate". After reviewing his "ministerial work log" with him for July and August it appears that his time management strategy is working pretty well for scheduled activities, and we all felt better. A total ministerial workload of 50 hours a week is his goal. It is the unpredicted events that can complicate his schedule (funerals, visitations, etc.).

Noteworthy activities for August were:

Pastor Charlie met twice with his "Spiritual Coach" at the Aisling Retreat House. It has been very helpful. The Pastor described his focus on the concept of "Action and Reflection" in his ministerial thought process.

He attended two conference events: The "Global Leadership Summit" and LEAD (Living Everyday as Disciples). Both worthwhile.

We asked how his wife Caroline feels about his workload and free time for family and recreation. Both Pastor and Bob followed up with her.

A wellness/exercise program is still pending. The pool and water aquatics are of particular interest. A program that could engage the whole family is most desirable. Pastor Charlie does walk every morning, and it provides both a physical and spiritual benefit.



Because of the nature of a "Mutual Ministry", our achievements are almost always the result of a cooperative process in which a *concern or opportunity* is identified by our committee, the Pastor, a Congregant, or Council, and we then put in place a plan to address them.
