

Immanuel's church council met Tuesday, October 9, 2018. The following business was discussed.

NEW BUSINESS

- Tyler Mullins is a Civil War enthusiast. He participates in reenactments and would like to share his knowledge with the members of Immanuel. Council suggested Tyler work with the Sunday school and Troop 320 to schedule a Gettysburg trip in the spring. Members of the congregation would be invited to attend.

OLD BUSINESS

- Committee reports for the congregation meeting Annual Reports are due to the office on October 9.
- After a long and detailed discussion, those in attendance approved the 2019 budget and recommended its referral to the congregation.
- Little Free Pantry—some construction issues have been addressed in an effort to prevent moisture causing a problem to the products. Twenty four families have contributed goods to the pantry and 15 families have taken needed items. Connor Vogelsang is making a donation to the Sunday school. His donation represents additional monies he raised for his Eagle Scout project.
- Frank Burnette reported that the vintage Sunday school doors will be retrieved. They are stored in Ray Ferrier's son in laws barn and Property is working with Ray to determine a convenient time for Immanuel to pick them up.
- The following was discussed on council members for 2019. Jamie Rooney and John Gregg will not be returning for a second term. All other council members are returning. Connie Dattilio, Sarah Marshall and Brittany Trott are nominated to stand for election to 3 year terms beginning in 2019.
- No information was presented concerning Website training for Jamie Rooney and Rachel Murphy. We are expecting information at the next meeting so needed training can begin.

STEPHEN MINISTRY

The Stephen Ministry team at Immanuel began our September meeting with feelings of loss. A Stephen Minister mourned the loss of her care receiver who had passed away recently. They had been in a Stephen Ministry relationship for two years. Connie shared a letter from Bob and Carol Nicoll, who are officially transferring to the Stephen Ministry organization at Carroll Lutheran Village, where they reside. Bob has been instrumental in starting a program there over the past year. Bob and Carol had been Stephen Ministers at Immanuel since 2010. Bob had been a Stephen Leader since 2012. The Stephen Ministry Team at Immanuel extends sincere thanks to Bob and Carol for their involvement, and to Bob for his strong leadership over the past 6 years.

In spite of our sense of loss, our Stephen Ministry program at Immanuel is thriving. We know we are in good hands as Connie Dattilio has taken over as our Stephen Leader. In addition, we are blessed to have Pastor Charlie actively involved in our ministry. During this same September meeting, two new care receivers were assigned, and a third person has since entered into a relationship with a Stephen Ministry caregiver. We continue to move forward in our ministry of caring.

We need more Stephen Ministers at Immanuel! Stephen Ministry caregiving does not cross genders. Men in need of Stephen Ministry are assigned only male caregivers, while women Stephen Ministers only work with women. At this time we have no male Stephen Ministers. We welcome both men and women interested in becoming a Stephen Minister. If you would like to know more about this confidential Christ-centered lay ministry and the training involved, Pastor Charlie or Connie can speak to you further.

The Stephen Ministers at Immanuel engage in both supervision related to their caregiver relationship, and ongoing training to broaden their skills as caregivers. In supervision meetings, care receivers are not identified by name to preserve the confidential nature of our lay ministry. Our training recently reviewed an important aspect of our ministry – listening. We actively listen without judgment as we engage with our care receivers in a Stephen Ministry relationship. We hope in turn that our care receivers feel valued and cared for during our conversations.

If you need the reassurance of God's love, and the knowledge that someone cares enough about you to share what you may be struggling with, look to Stephen Ministry for caring and support. Contact Connie Dattilio or see Pastor Charlie to make a referral.


