From The Pastor's Desk....

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Let me be the first to wish you a Happy New Year!

On Thanksgiving weekend, Nov. 26 - 27, we begin a new church year as we enter the first week of Advent. During the coming church year we will be reading primarily from the Gospel according to Matthew. This Gospel should be near and dear to our hearts at Immanuel because Matthew is the Gospel of Immanuel: God with us. Matthew's Gospel begins with the angel's visit to Joseph, telling him that the child to be born to his fiancée Mary will be the one promised centuries before. "All this took place to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: 'Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel', which means, 'God is with us." (Matthew 1:22-23)

Matthew's Gospel is also the one that contains the promise of Jesus' continuing presence among us. In Matthew 18:20, Jesus promises, "where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." And following his resurrection, Jesus gives his disciples the Great Commission: "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you." Jesus' last words to his disciples, and the last words of Matthew's Gospel are: "and remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matt. 28:18-20)

Matthew's Gospel also speaks of Jesus' continuing, hidden presence among us in those who need him the most: "I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me... Just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me."

MUTUAL MINISTRY

- Our "Capture Log" is used to record problems and opportunities presented to the Committee. We can report 18 of the inputs are "Completed or Addressed", 4 are "New or In Process". Recognize that this information for the most part is confidential.
- To better facilitate getting congregational inputs, we have been using a locked "Opinion Box" in the rear of the church. Only the Pastor or Mutual Ministry Committee Chair has access. Write-on cards to be used with this system are now placed in the pew racks as well as with the Box.
- In our first months since the arrival of Pastor Charlie we have focused in particular on the Pastor and his family's well being. We are comfortable at this point with our expectations and the Pastor's attention in preserving a "Healthy Balance". A more detailed summary of the Pastor's healthy regimen can be found in the November "Visitor" Newsletter.
- The Committee will be devising a survey/questionnaire to be used in early 2017. A survey should surface some beneficial feedback for all agencies in the church. A team has been formed to identify areas of interest and develop questions for the survey.
- The Committee has set our meeting strategy for 2017, and we will meet formally every other month.
- The Pastoral/Family health and balance are well under control.
- The volume of inputs to the Committee has been light, and we can address most of these without the need for a formal meeting.

Our members are a very busy group. This will provide a little more flexibility in their schedule.

Our achievements are almost always the result of a cooperative process in which a *concern or opportunity* is identified by our committee, the Pastor, a Congregant, or Council, and we then put in place a plan to address them. To express any concerns, opportunities, or comments please use the Congregational Input Form (included in last months newsletter and also available in the back of pews). Place completed forms in the locked box in the back of the Sanctuary.
