²¹But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, ²³since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; ²⁴they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; ²⁶it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus.

TODAY, we celebrate the **Festival of the Reformation**. The liturgical color for Reformation is red. History tells us that at the end of the seventeenth century, many Lutheran churches celebrated a festival commemorating Martin Luther's posting of his Ninety-Five Theses, a summary of the abuses within the Roman Catholic Church during this time. At the heart of the reform movement was the gospel ~ the "good news" ~ that it is by grace through our faith that we are justified and set free by Our Lord, Jesus Christ. Today, around the world, Lutherans will begin a 'kick-off' year of activities to celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation in 2017!!



The people of Trinity UCC and Lazarus UCC have invited us to a special service at 10:45am today, Reformation Sunday at Trinity, next door to Immanuel Church. The service will include a special appearance by Martin Luther himself, portrayed by retired Lutheran pastor Richard Goodlin. Fellowship following the service.
