TODAY, Lutherans observe the **Feast of the Transfiguration**. This festival is a bridge between the Advent-Christmas-Epiphany cycle that comes to a close today and the Lenten-Easter cycle that begins on Ash Wednesday, March 1st.

On the mount of transfiguration, Jesus is revealed as God's beloved Son, echoing the words at his baptism. This vision of glory sustains us as Jesus faces his impending death in Jerusalem. 
