WELCOME to our 500th Reformation Anniversary Service at Immanuel! The Reformation begun by Martin Luther did not abandon the theological, sacramental, and liturgical traditions of the church. It sought to reform them so that the gospel would shine through all the church does. Since the beginning of the Lutheran Reformation to this day, there have been 26,000 Sundays to proclaim the gospel and share in the gracious presence of Christ in the communion meal. How many souls have heard the good news because of what happened in 1517? How many hearts have been transformed? Today, let's celebrate the impact of the Lutheran Reformation on the real lives of ordinary people like us! (Sundays and Seasons, 2017)

Six Centuries of Praise

One of the greatest gifts of the Reformation was a renewed emphasis on music and singing. During our worship service today we will sing one hymn or song from each of the six centuries since the Reformation, and a second from the 20th century. Pastor Charlie will lead us in the 21st century selection, by contemporary Lutheran singer/songwriter Rachel Kurz, during the sermon.

16th century: A Mighty Fortress is Our God (Martin Luther, 1529)

17th century: O Sacred Head (Paul Gerhardt, 1656)

18th century: Rock of Ages (Augustus Toplady, 1776)

19th century: The Church's One Foundation (Samuel Stone, 1866)

20th century: I, the Lord of Sea and Sky (Dan Schutte, 1981)

20th century: I Was There to Hear Your Borning Cry (John Ylvisaker, 1985)

21st century: Make a Difference (Rachel Kurz, 2012)
