

The Season of Advent continues this weekend (Advent 3) and concludes through the <u>9am morning worship</u> on Sunday, December 24<sup>th</sup>. The color for Advent is <u>blue</u>, as displayed on the altar, lectern and pulpit parament cloths. The Advent wreath, with its four blue candles surrounding the center Christ candle, will be lit one candle in succession for each of the four weeks during Advent. Each weekend, the congregation will sing an additional verse of the traditional Advent hymn ~ "Light One Candle" (ELW # 240). Join us at Immanuel for this wonderful time of the year, as we prepare to make the journey to Bethlehem and witness the birth of Jesus!

### The Advent Wreath

One of the best known customs for the season is the **Advent Wreath. This weekend,** we will light three blue candles. The wreath and winter candle-lighting, in the midst of growing darkness, strengthen some of the Advent images found in the Bible. The unbroken circle of greens is clearly an image of everlasting life, a victory wreath, the crown of Christ, or the wheel of time, itself. Christians use the wreath as a sign that Christ reaches into our time to lead us to the light of everlasting life. The four blue candles mark the progress of the four weeks of Advent and the growth of light. Sometimes, the wreath is embellished with natural dried flowers or fruit. Its evergreen branches lead the household and the congregation to the evergreen Christmas tree. In many homes, the family gathers for prayer around the wreath.
