### FIRST READING

**2 Kings 2:1-12**

<sup>1</sup>Now when the LORD was about to take Elijah up to heaven by a whirlwind, Elijah and Elisha were on their way from Gilgal. <sup>2</sup>Elijah said to Elisha, "Stay here; for the LORD has sent me as far as Bethel." But Elisha said, "As the LORD lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So they went down to Bethel. <sup>3</sup>The company of prophets who were in Bethel came out to Elisha, and said to him, "Do you know that today the LORD will take your master away from you?" And he said, "Yes, I know; keep silent."

<sup>4</sup>Elijah said to him, "Elisha, stay here; for the LORD has sent me to Jericho." But he said, "As the LORD lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So they came to Jericho. <sup>5</sup>The company of prophets who were at Jericho drew near to Elisha, and said to him, "Do you know that today the LORD will take your master away from you?" And he answered, "Yes, I know; be silent."

<sup>6</sup>Then Elijah said to him, "Stay here; for the LORD has sent me to the Jordan." But he said, "As the LORD lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So the two of them went on. <sup>7</sup>Fifty men of the company of prophets also went, and stood at some distance from them, as they both were standing by the Jordan. <sup>8</sup>Then Elijah took his mantle and rolled it up, and struck the water; the water was parted to the one side and to the other, until the two of them crossed on dry ground.

<sup>9</sup>When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, "Tell me what I may do for you, before I am taken from you." Elisha said, "Please let me inherit a double share of your spirit." <sup>10</sup>He responded, "You have asked a hard thing; yet, if you see me as I am being taken from you, it will be granted you; if not, it will not." <sup>11</sup>As they continued walking and talking, a chariot of fire and horses of fire separated the two of them, and Elijah ascended in a whirlwind into heaven. <sup>12</sup>Elisha kept watching and crying out, "Father, father! The chariots of Israel and its horsemen!" But when he could no longer see him, he grasped his own clothes and tore them in two pieces. The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

## Mark 9:2-9

<sup>2</sup>Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain apart, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, <sup>3</sup>and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no one on earth could bleach them. <sup>4</sup>And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus. <sup>5</sup>Then Peter said to Jesus, “Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.” <sup>6</sup>He did not know what to say, for they were terrified. <sup>7</sup>Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice, “This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!” <sup>8</sup>Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them any more, but only Jesus.

**TODAY** at 9am service, we celebrate the **Transfiguration of Our Lord**. This festival is a bridge between the Advent~Christmas~Epiphany cycle that comes to a close today and the Lenten~Easter cycle that begins in three days on Ash Wednesday, February 14<sup>th</sup>. The Sundays after Epiphany began with Jesus’ baptism and end with three disciples’ vision of his transfiguration. In Mark’s story of Jesus’ baptism, apparently only Jesus sees the Spirit descending and hears the words from heaven. But, now Jesus’ three closest friends hear, on the Mount of Transfiguration, the same words naming him ~*God’s beloved Son!* After our Transfiguration Service, the ‘alleluia’ portion of our liturgy will be *‘buried’* or omitted during the six-week season of Lent and will be sung again at Easter!

***Our sisters and brothers in Puerto Rico*** continue to be devastated by the effects of hurricanes earlier this season. With other synods in the church, we are working together to raise an offering for the congregations of the Caribbean Synod to help them continue the important work of recovery.



This weekend, Feb 10-11, all congregations and ministries of our Synod will receive a special offering for Puerto Rico. You may also mail or drop off your offering to the church office, marked “Puerto Rico.”

**Immanuel celebrates her 258<sup>th</sup> birthday** this weekend. Our rich heritage began one cold winter day, on February 12, 1760, when a small quaint group of German-speaking Lutheran men gathered in a log cabin not far from our mighty Oak Tree. Our Archives, displayed in the auditorium, relate this story through preserved handmade quilts, old German bibles, pictorial displays of former pastors, glass cabinets of 'retired' sterling communion chalices and ornate communion cloths from earlier years of service along with many other donated items. Take a '*gallery walk*' through our history by reminiscing through albums of photographs, letters and moments of former Sunday School classes, catechism classes, Luther League youth group gatherings and the Ladies Aid Society, who prepared meals in the social hall, along with many newspaper clippings saved to remember Immanuel through the years! **HAPPY 258<sup>th</sup> BIRTHDAY, IMMANUEL!!**
