

At every beginning there is a yearning for the one who is coming.
O Emmanuel, **Open us up to your coming.**

We gather together to allow our deeply held hopes to be reshaped by God's promises. O Emmanuel, **Open us up to your coming.**

We wait for the day when God will make for us a future that is no longer predicated on our fear. O Emmanuel, **Open us up to your coming.**

We find a new receptivity within us that desires God's will over our own will and relies on God's justice and mercy to accomplish it.

O Emmanuel, **Open us up to your coming.**

Jesus, we welcome your presence now with the lighting of these candles, whose flames bring warmth to winter and fill this place with the glow of hope. **Amen.**

FIRST READING

Isaiah 12:2-6

The prophet calls us to praise and to put our trust in the God who saves us, and to declare God's mighty deeds to all nations on earth.

²Surely God is my salvation; I will trust, and will not be afraid, for the Lord GOD is my strength and my might; he has become my salvation.

³With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation. ⁴And you will say in that day: Give thanks to the LORD, call on his name; make known his deeds among the nations; proclaim that his name is exalted.

⁵Sing praises to the LORD, for he has done gloriously; let this be known in all the earth. ⁶Shout aloud and sing for joy, O royal Zion, for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel.

SECOND READING

Philippians 4:4-7

Despite being in prison, Paul is remarkably upbeat as he writes this letter. Here, he urges his friends in Philippi to trust God with all their worries and concerns, with the hope they will experience God's joy and peace.

⁴Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. ⁵Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. ⁶Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. The word of the Lord.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

The holy gospel according to Luke.

Glory to you, O Lord.

John the Baptist heralds the mighty one “who is coming.” John teaches that preparation for God’s reign is not a matter of identity but of bearing fruits of merciful justice, radical generosity, and vocational integrity.

⁷John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, “You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? ⁸Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, ‘We have Abraham as our ancestor’; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. ⁹Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.”

¹⁰And the crowds asked him, “What then should we do?” ¹¹In reply he said to them, “Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise.” ¹²Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, “Teacher, what should we do?” ¹³He said to them, “Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you.” ¹⁴Soldiers also asked him, “And we, what should we do?” He said to them, “Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages.”

¹⁵As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, ¹⁶John answered all of them by saying, “I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹⁷His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.”

¹⁸So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.

MIDWEEK PRAYER AND BIBLE STUDY GROUPS: All About Angels



Weather Cancellation Policy @ Immanuel

In order to care for the safety of each member of the congregation, weather conditions and circumstances may establish the need to cancel worship services and/or activities at Immanuel. The decision to cancel activities will be made by a review of the NOAA.gov website, in consultation with the Council President and Pastor and (optionally) the executive committee.

Every attempt will be made to announce any decision to cancel services and/or activities at least 2 hours prior to such activities through the following official means:

- Immanuel's Office Phone Recorded Message (410-374-4463)
- Immanuel's Facebook page

- Immanuel's Web site (www.immanuellutherancmd.org)

When possible, an alternative time will be scheduled and announced.

We demonstrate our caring heart by reaching out to our neighbors in many ways with gifts of food, warm clothing, and other necessities. Perhaps the most important gift we can offer during this season of the year is the gift of God's perfect love all wrapped up in Jesus, the babe of Bethlehem.

Of course, God wants us to be sharing our faith with others and inviting others to worship throughout the year. But this is the time when non-churchgoers are most likely to accept an invitation. As you think about whom you might invite, I encourage you to cast a wide net that includes friends and family, neighbors and co-workers, and people you interact with where you buy your groceries, get your hair cut, stop for lunch or coffee.

Every invitation to come to church is more likely to succeed when you are not just inviting people but praying for them as well. Try writing a list of people you want to invite (you don't have to know their names—God already does!) and take a few minutes each day to pray for them before you invite them. Ask God to bless them, to open their hearts to receive your invitation, and to provide an opportunity for you to extend the invitation. Once you have invited them, continue to pray each day for the Holy Spirit to work through your invitation to draw them closer to God and to the church.

Expect God to answer your prayers and bring them to church on Christmas Eve. Be prepared to welcome them warmly, as well as other newcomers whom God may send, and follow up with them as you are able.
