



(Ephrathah refers to the area around Bethlehem.) This king will restore Israel and bring peace. New Testament writers understood this passage to be referring to Jesus.

²But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah, who are one of the little clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient days.

³Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labor has brought forth; then the rest of his kindred shall return

to the people of Israel.


⁴And he shall stand and feed his flock in the strength of the LORD, in the majesty of the name of the LORD his God.

SECOND READING

Hebrews 10:5-10

The author of Hebrews uses the image of religious sacrifice to convey the significance of Christ's coming. Through obedient acceptance of God's will, Christ allows his own body to become the greatest sacrifice of all, one through which we are made a holy people. ⁵Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said,

"Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me; ⁶in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure.

⁷Then I said, 'See, God, I have come to do your will, O God'

(in the scroll of the book it is written of me)."

⁸When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), ⁹then he added, "See, I have come to do your will." He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. ¹⁰And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit ⁴²and exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. ⁴³And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? ⁴⁴For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy. ⁴⁵And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord."

Taken from Pastor Charlie's message in the December newsletter:

We demonstrate our caring heart by reaching out to our neighbors in many ways with gifts of food, warm clothing, and other necessities. Perhaps the most important gift we can offer during this season of the year is the gift of God's perfect love all wrapped up in Jesus, the babe of Bethlehem.

Of course, God wants us to be sharing our faith with others and inviting others to worship throughout the year. But this is the time when non-churchgoers are most likely to accept an invitation. As you think about whom you might invite, I encourage you to cast a wide net that includes friends and family, neighbors and co-workers, and people you interact with where you buy your groceries, get your hair cut, stop for lunch or coffee.

Every invitation to come to church is more likely to succeed when you are not just inviting people but praying for them as well. Try writing a list of people you want to invite (you don't have to know their names– God already does!) and take a few minutes each day to pray for them before you invite them. Ask God to bless them, to open their hearts to receive your invitation, and to provide an opportunity for you to extend the invitation. Once you have invited them, continue to pray each day for the Holy Spirit to work through your invitation to draw them closer to God and to the church.

Expect God to answer your prayers and bring them to church on Christmas Eve. Be prepared to welcome them warmly, as well as other newcomers whom God may send, and follow up with them as you are able.
